Topic

The Acts 2 Church. Maybe it's just in my circle of friends and colleagues, but I feel like this one comes up the most often out of every passage of scripture. It might be a romanticized idea of "what if's" and "what could be's." But maybe it's more than that.

As creatives working in Arts and Entertainment, many of us are familiar with contracted work. This week on the podcast, we discussed sharing contractors between companies when we hear of a need within our work community. This is quite countercultural to the business world's standard "What's mine is mine" mentality. But what could this mean within a culture of Christian creatives? Is this another way to practically live into an "Acts 2" mentality?

Question 2:

Question 3:

How do you think pain, fear, or pride can cause us to hold onto things we should be letting go of?

Question 4:

Do you think an "Acts 2" model should be something your church strives for? If so, what are some of the first steps you would need to take?

The Greek word "koinonia" ($\kappa o\iota v\omega v(q)$ means "The act of sharing in the activities or privileges of an intimate association or group; especially used of marriage and churches." Whether it be your church body or your work environment, challenging ourselves with the difficult kindergarten lessons on sharing can be helpful for our faith. Something inside us, whether it be fear, pride, or pain, wants us to hold onto what we have with a tight grip, but God wants us to let go and share what we have with one another in our communities.
